<p>Look for an <b>acorn</b> on the ground.</p>	<p>Find a fallen <b>pinecone</b>.</p>	<p>Find a <b>small stick</b> or <b>twig</b> that has on the ground.</p>	<p>Discover a <b>seed pod</b> from a tree (like those from a maple or sycamore).</p>	<p>Spot a <b>feather</b> that a bird may have dropped.</p>
<p>Look for a <b>mushroom</b> growing in moist, shaded areas.</p>	<p>Observe a <b>squirrel</b> in action, gathering nuts or running around.</p>	<p>Try to <b>spot birds</b> flying in groups, possibly migrating for the winter.</p>	<p>Step on a dry, <b>crunchy leaf</b>.</p>	<p>Touch or observe the <b>bark of a tree</b>.</p>
<p>Find a <b>berry</b> or <b>fruit</b> on a bush or tree (but don't pick or eat it!).</p>	<p>Look up and find a <b>cloud</b> in the <b>shape of an animal</b> or <b>object</b>.</p>	<p>Spot a <b>grasshopper</b>, <b>beetle</b>, or <b>another insect</b> before they hide for winter.</p>	<p>Stand in the <b>shade of a tree</b> and check it off.</p>	<p>Find a <b>spider web</b>, which is more visible in the fall due to dew.</p>

## ***Safety tips:***

Look for a **leaf** that has turned **yellow**.

Spot a **leaf** that is **orange**.

Pick up a **leaf** that has turned **brown**.

Find a leaf that is **more than one color**.

Look for an **acorn** on the ground.

Find a fallen **pinecone**.

Find a **small stick** or **twig** on the ground.

Discover a **seed pod** from a tree (like those from a maple or sycamore).

Spot a **feather** that a bird may have dropped.

Look for a **mushroom** growing in moist, shaded areas.

Observe a **squirrel** in action, gathering nuts or running around.

Try to **spot birds** flying in groups, possibly migrating for the winter.

Step on a dry, **crunchy leaf**.

Touch or observe the **bark of a tree**.

Find a **berry** or **fruit** on a bush or tree (but don't pick or eat it!).

Look up and find a **cloud** in the **shape of an animal** or **object**.

Spot a **grasshopper**, **beetle**, or **another insect** before they hide for winter.

Stand in the **shade of a tree** and check it off.

Find a **spider web**, which is more visible in the fall due to dew.
